		compelling, then think through why you find them so compelling. Sit down with a willing friend or parent and explain why you find those sections interesting. Read them out loud and have a discussion about what Augustine is talking about and why you think it is important.

		☐ Choose an aspect of <i>Confessions</i> that you find interesting, then write a 1 to 2 page
		paper that explains it. For instance, you might examine his use of the idea of "habit" throughout his book; his style of talking to God as a method of writing; the particular way he uses scripture; or his understanding of a doctrine such as original sin or God's providence. When you're finished, you can read it out loud first to yourself to catch mistakes/errors/problems. Then, once you've edited it multiple times and can read it to yourself without finding any problems, read it out loud to a sibling, parent, or friend.
